

Itinerary for Kathmandu UNESCO World Heritage Sightseeing Day Tour Package

Morning: Start your day with a comfortable car ride from your hotel to Swayambhunath Temple. It's a short 15-minute drive, and you'll then walk up a stairway to the main stupa. Swayambhunath, also known as Monkey Temple, offers a 360-degree view of Kathmandu from its hilltop location. The ancient temple, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, holds cultural significance for both Buddhists and Hindus.

Next Stop:: Head to Kathmandu Durbar Square, also known as Hanuman Dhoka. This historic square, enlisted as a UNESCO World Heritage Site, is rich in temples, shrines, and a palace reflecting medieval art and architecture. Take a stroll, visit the museum if you're into history, and explore small shops offering Nepalese handicrafts. Lunch Option: You can have lunch either in the Durbar Square area or drive to Bouddhanath Stupa.

Afternoon:: Continue your tour to Bouddhanath Stupa, another UNESCO World Heritage Site. This impressive structure is one of the largest stupas in South Asia and holds great significance in Tibetan Buddhism. Post-earthquake reconstruction in 2016 restored its grandeur. Explore the surrounding shops, restaurants, and cafes offering multi-cuisine options and Buddhist-related handicrafts.

Final Stop:: Conclude your day at Pashupatinath Temple, dedicated to Lord Shiva. This fifth-century temple, one of the most important in Asia for Shiva devotees, features a stunning pagoda-style shrine with gold-plated roofs. The complex stretches along the sacred Bagmati River, and though non-Hindus can't enter the main temple, they can explore the premises.
